Emergency Loans	Applications available the first day of classes –Ask/Apply in person at Financial Aid Office	A maximum of \$500.00 is available (if qualified) for students waiting for their OSAP assistance.

**Other Points of Interest:**

- Students must maintain 60% of a full course load (40% for students with permanent disabilities) to be eligible for OSAP and to keep interest-free status on previous student loans.
- Academic progress is monitored.
- OSAP students are responsible for promptly notifying the Financial Aid Office, in writing, of changes to the income or assets reported, changes to address, changes to course load, financial, academic, family and/or period of study status, or if any other information provided has changed since the original application.
- All income is verified with Canada Revenue Agency.
- Monies from OSAP are not available before the start of classes, therefore, students are expected to make arrangements to complete an OSAP Tuition Deferral and pay a \$100.00 fee that will be applied towards their tuition.
